THE PERSONAL EXEMPTION IS GONE!

1.15-150 kg Gross Mass Exemption – This exemption has replaced the personal exemption but it also now applies to contractors.

WHAT HAPPENED TO SPECIAL PROVISION 42!

Special Provision 42 has been repealed but check out the exemptions. Remember this exemption only applies to documentation and training. The appropriate safety marks must be displayed and visible from the outside of the vehicle.

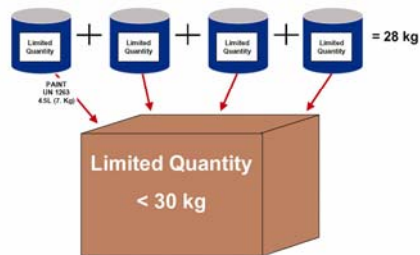
1.32.1 Class 2, Gases, That May Be Identified as UN1075, LIQUEFIED PETROLEUM GAS - (1)

The following dangerous goods may be identified by the UN number UN1075 and the shipping name LIQUEFIED PETROLEUM GAS instead of the UN number and shipping name identified for them: **(a)** UN1011, BUTANE; **(b)** UN1012, BUTYLENE; **(c)** UN1055, ISOBUTYLENE; **(d)** UN1077, PROPYLENE; **(e)** UN1969, ISOBUTANE; and **(f)** UN1978, PROPANE. **(2)** The shipping name of the dangerous goods listed in paragraphs (1)(a) to (f) may be shown on the shipping document, in parentheses, following the words LIQUEFIED PETROLEUM GAS. **(3)** If either UN1077, PROPYLENE or UN1978, PROPANE is to be transported on a road or railway vehicle on board a ship and is identified as LIQUEFIED PETROLEUM GAS on the shipping document in accordance with subsection (1), the shipping name PROPYLENE or PROPANE, as appropriate, must be shown on the shipping document, in parentheses, following the words LIQUEFIED PETROLEUM GAS.

LIMITED QUANTITY EXEMPTION – You now have a choice! A couple of years ago the UN adopted a standardized safety mark for Limited Quantity shipments. If you had a Limited Quantity shipment of paint the package could be marked with either of the following safety marks.

Chinese restriction on DG movement during Olympics

-The Chinese authorities have placed some extreme restrictions on the import of dangerous goods for a four-month period covering the Olympics in Beijing. According to an announcement received last week by operators in the region, as from June 1 the movement of all dangerous goods will be banned in Beijing, Tianjin, Qinhuangdao, Shanghai, Shenyang and Hong Kong; furthermore, the discharge and loading of dangerous goods will be prohibited at some ports. The ban imposed by the National Security Bureau will apply equally to fireworks and manufacturers have been advised to adjust their production schedules so that the movement of these goods is not necessary during the period. Shippers are advised to check with their partners in China on the latest status during the next few months.

Ontario No Frills Store Fined- 698954 Ontario Inc. has been fined \$30,000, plus a victim fine surcharge, after pleading guilty to violating the Ontario Water Resources Act. The company, which operates as Mike, & Lori's No Frills grocery store in North Bay experienced a power outage, causing a large quantity of food products at the store to degrade. A compactor was used to compact the spoiled food. During that process an unknown quantity of liquid leaked from the compactor, entered the storm sewer and flowed into Pinewood Park Creek.
